FOREWORD

The developing nations across the globe brought the environmental concerns into the development process much later compared to the developed world. The year 1972, when the global Conference on Human Environment was held at Stockholm, can be considered the watershed year for environmental management in the country. Though certain laws like Bengal Smoke Nuisance Act, 1905, Bombay Smoke Nuisance Act, 1912 were in operation to deal with pollution and environment related issues in specific areas, much of environmental legislation evolved in a comprehensive manner only after the 42nd amendment was brought about in the Constitution. While Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 is the precursor to many of the pollution control laws, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 is seen as an omni-bus piece of legislation. Drawing strength from this Act, Union Ministry of Environment and Forests published various notifications with wider ramifications and areas of application.

In the State, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board constituted in the year 1982, has been originally entrusted with the responsibility of implementing the provisions of the Water Act and the rules made there under. The organisation's role as a regulator enlarged manifold with the multitude of notifications that followed. Parallely, many Government Orders came to be issued in connection with the development of institutional mechanisms, evolution of standards and guidelines in the areas of pollution control and environmental management and their enforcement. In the Silver Jubilee year of TNPCB, it was considered expedient to compile all relevant Government orders in form of a Compendium so as to make it as a reference material to all concerned. I am happy to note such initiative has been taken at the instance of the then Chairmen of the Board Thiru Surjit K. Chaudhary,I.A.S., and Thiru K.A. Mathew, I.A.S.. It is heartening to learn that the officers in the Corporate Office under the guidance of the Board's Member Secretary Dr.T. Sekar. I.F.S. have painstakingly collected many relevant Government orders that form part of this book.

I consider this as a timely and worthwhile effort and congratulate all those involved in the process of bringing out this Compendium.

PREFACE

Environment Management and Pollution control are recognised as part of human development in any country. In to-day's context, environmental impact of human activities and ways and means to manage the same are seen as matters of primary concern for the policy makers, development planners and environment managers alike. The comprehensive institutional mechanism for pollution prevention and abatement dawned in the country with the promulgation of the Central Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act in 1974 and the rules made there under. The Central Pollution Control Board and the various State Pollution Control Boards and the Union Territory Pollution Control Committees came to be established as provided for in the Water Act, 1974.

While a full-fledged Ministry of Environment and Forests was formed in the Union Government in 1985 to legislate and evolve policies on environmental matters, the Pollution Control Boards were charged with the task of developing guidelines, standards, programmes etc., and of overseeing their effective implementation by all concerned. Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board was constituted on 27.02.1982 by the Government of Tamil Nadu and like similar Boards in other States was initially concerned with the implementation of the provisions of Water Act. The organisation was renamed as Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board in the year 1983 and its scope of functions enlarged into implementation of the provisions of Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the various notifications issued there under. TNPCB is presently celebrating its Silver jubilee.

Environmental matters have wider ramifications in different areas of development including manufacturing, trade and service sectors. Therefore, many instructions and guidelines were brought about with regard to environment management in the country and the State. These informations are available in form of various Government orders and it was considered necessary to collate all relevant orders in form of a Compendium so that the document will serve as a reference material and a ready reckoner to all concerned. The then Chairman Thiru Surjit K. Chaudary, I.A.S., assigned the Member Secretary with the task of compiling all the relevant Government Orders. The Committee, constituted for this purpose comprising of senior officers of the Board went into the task of picking up all Government orders relating to pollution control and environmental management. In doing so, many Environmental Engineers and Environmental Scientists in the Corporate Office rendered assistance in scanning the stock files for laying hands on the relevant Government Orders.. Though it may be difficult to acknowledge the contribution of each one of them individually, the services of Thiruvalargal R. Rajamanickam, A. Samuel Rajkumar, D. Vasudevan, Raghupathy, Nagarajan, M. Muralidharan, Assistant Engineers, M.Sabapathy and Dr. Sukumar, Deputy Managers (Lab), Bala, Environmental Scientist, K. Dhanasekaran and S. Elangovan, Deputy Managers in the compilation and proof reading works deserve special mention. The continued support extended by Thiru K.A. Mathew, I.A.S., the then Chairman of TNPCB and by Dr. N. Sundaradevan, I.A.S., its present Chairman in the Silver Jubilee year are gratefully acknowledged.

ORDER

In G.O.Ms.No.926/Health/dated 19.4.1972, the Government sanctioned the formation of the Department of Environmental Hygiene with the Special Officer in the grade of Chief Engineer and other technical and administrative staff to undertake a systematic study of the problems, viz pollution of water, air and land on account of causes such as industrial effluents, industrial gases; use of chemical pesticides, human negligence etc. In G.O.Ms.No.340, Health dated 19.2.1982, the Government constituted the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board with effect from 27.2.1982 and also appointed the Special Officer, Department of Environmental Hygiene to hold full charge of the

post of Chairman of the Tamil Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board with effect from 27.2.1982 in addition to his duties as Special Officer, Department of Environmental Hygiene. The Chairman of the Board has also been permitted to utilise temporarily the services of the entire Department of Environmental Hygiene for the Board, till orders are issued merging the Department of Environmental Hygiene with the Board.

2. The Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board, at its meeting held on 21.4.82, resolved to approve the proposal for the merger of the Department of Environmental Hygiene with the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board and to address the Govt of approval of the proposal.

3. The Government have examined carefully and approve the proposal of the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board contain in the resolution No.9 dated 21.4.1982 to merge the Department of Environmental Hygiene with the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board and to transfer the staff (including those on deputation) working in the Department of Environmental Hygiene with the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board, as shown in the Annexure to this order subject to their option for permanent obsorption in the service of the Board. The above orders take effect from 27.2.82 the date from which the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board was constituted.

4. The Special Officer, Dept. of Environmental Hygiene / Chairman of the Board is requested to take necessary immediate action with reference to the instructions issued in G.O.Ms.No.284 Finance Dept/dt. 31.3.1980 regarding the board settlement of terminal benefits etc of the staff absorbed in the Board and send a report to Government in due course.

ORDER

In the Government Order first read above, the Government have ordered, among other things, that no industry causing serious water pollution should be permitted within one kilometre from the embankments of rivers, streams, dams etc., and that the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board should furnish a list of such industries to all local bodies. It has been suggested that it is necessary to have a sharper definition for water sources so that ephemeral water collections like rain water ponds, drains, sewerages (bio-degradable) etc., may be excluded from the purview of the above order. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has stated that the scope of the Government Order may be restricted to reservoirs, rivers and public drinking water sources. He has also stated that there should be a complete ban on location of highly polluting industries within 1 kilometer of certain water sources.

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2. The Government have carefully examined the above suggestions. The Government impose a total ban on the setting up of the highly polluting industries mentioned in Annexure – I to this order within one kilometre from the embankments of the water sources mentioned in Annexure – II to this order.

3. The Government also direct that under any circumstances if any highly polluting industry is proposed to be set up within one kilometer from the embankments of water sources other than those mentioned in Annexure – II to

this order, the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board should examine the case and obtain the approval of the Government for it.

4. The receipt of this order may be acknowledge.

ORDER

The Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Cess Act, 1977 (C.A. 36 of 1977) applies to all the States to which the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 (C.A. 6 1974) applies, and the Union Territories. The Water (Prevention Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 has been adopted by the of Tamil Nadu by a resolution passed by the Legislature of Article 252 of the Constitution. The Water (Prevention Control of Pollution) Cess Act, 1977 provides for levy and action of a cess on water consumed by persons carrying of certain industries and by local authorities, with a view to meet the resources of the Central and State Pollution Control Boards. Under this Act, the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board been authorized to collect water cess from individuals and authority liable to pay the same and to pay the amount so collected to the central Government by virtue of sub-section (4) of Section 6 of central Act 36 of 1977. Every local authority liable to pay cess under section 3 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Cess Act, 1977 and to furnish a return to the assessing authority (i.e.

Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board) regarding the quantity of water consumed as required under Section 5 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1977 read with rule 4 of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Cess Rules, 1978. As per Government of India's Gazette notification dated 17.12.1991 the Water Cess is to be levied form the Industry / Local authority is as indicated in the Annexure.

2. In the G.O.read above the Government have issued instructions to all local bodies on prompt furnishing of the and payment of cess amount under section 5 and 6 of the Water prevention and control of Pollution) Cell, Act, 1977.

3. However, the local bodies have pleaded their inability to pay the water cess as demanded by the Pollution Control Board for the reasons such as, very heavily burdened with financial commitment towards the maintenance of a number of civic amenities practical difficulties in assessing the total quantum of water actually drawn in respect of water drawn from subsoil water through hand pumps etc., no equipments or facilities in the villages to quantify or make assessments etc.

4. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board pointedout that quite a lot of practical difficulties have been encountered in collecting water cess from the local bodies.

5. The Government have carefully examined the difficult in consultation with all concerned departments. As per the narms the liability to pay the water cess is that of the local body. The question of collecting from the consumer and passing on the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board is only an administrative convenience; and the basic liability of the local body remain. Since most of the local bodies are not taking water on the body of metered supply, but only levying a bulk rate, The Government direct that the local bodies would levy this cess as an additional over the bulk rate charged, collect the amount and remit to the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.

6. The Government direct that the local authorities should make payment of cess at the beginning of each half

7. The local authorities are also requested to apply consent of the Tamil Nadu Pollution control Baord and to remit the consent fee and water cess promptly.

8. The Commissioner of Municipal Administration, the Director of Rural Development and the Director of Town Panchayat are requested to communicate this order to all Municipal Corporations, Madras Metrowater Supply and Sewerage Board / Municipalities / Panchayat Union Commissioners and Executive Officers of Town Panchayat respectively for necessary action.

9. This order takes effect from 01.04.1992.

ORDER

In June 1990, the Government of India have announced a scheme for providing financial assistance for promoting combined facilities for treatment of effluent (CETPS) and solid waste generated in clusters of small scale units. This scheme has been extended to provide technical support. In respect of Common Effluent Treatment plant Co-ordinated by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, the fund towards subsidy sanctioned by Govt. is being released by the Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board which is sponsoring authority. The pattern of financing of the Common Effluent Treatment Plant has already been fixed as follows:

1.	Promoters contribution	:	20% of total project cost
2.	Long term loan from IDBI or othe	er	
	financial institution	:	30% of total project cost
3.	Subsidy by State Government	:	25% or Rs.50 lakhs on total
			project cost.
4.	Subsidy by Govt. of India	:	25% or Rs.50 lakhs on total
			project cost.

The Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests have already indicated that the Central assistance will be in the nature of a matching contribution with reference to the contribution made by the State Government on the basis of financing pattern for projects in the respective States. For sanctioning State subsidy, the concerned Common Effluent Treatment Plant Co. has to sand the following details:

i. Cost of the Project Report

ii. Physical and Financial Progress Report

- iii. Cost of NEERI approval
- iv. Copy of IDBI loan sanction order/agreement.

2. In the G.O. first read above and subsequently amended in Govt. letter No.13107/ECI/91-3 dated 19.7.91, Govt. have approved the proposal of Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board for establishment of Common Effluent Treatment Plant in Tamil Nadu at a total cost of Rs.3,477 lakhs for 4 years from 1990-91 to 1993-94. In the said order, among other things, the Govt. have sanctioned a sum of Rs.37.50 lakhs to establish Common Effluent Treatment Plant at Tirupur. In the G.O. second read above among other things, the Govt. have sanctioned a sum of Rs.21.14 lakhs to establish Common Effluent Treatment Plant at Kanur (Dyeing)

3. During 1996-97 Govt. have sanctioned subsidies to Rs.468.5 lakhs towards the State's share of subsidty for 10 Common Effluent Treatment Plant Schemes in various G.Os covering tanneries, Dyeing units and Hotel.

4. The Chairman, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board has stated that the tanneries and Textile Dyeing Industries in the State are under tremendous pressure to put up Effluent Treatment Plant due to the orders of Supreme Court of India and High Court at Chennai. These Industries have been requested the Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board for early sanction of subsidies so that they could complete the Common Effluent Treatment Plant in time.

5. The Chairman, Tamil nadu Pollution Control Board has sent proposals to the Govt. and requested to sanction the State subsidies to the Common Effluent Treatment Plant Schemes as detailed below.

6. The Govt. after careful consideration accept the proposal of the Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board and sanction a sum of Rs.851.97 lakhs (Rupees Eight Hundred and fifty one lakhs and ninety seven thousand only) as State Government's subsidy towards implementation of 21 Common Effluent Treatment Plants for the year 1997-98 referred to in Annexure I and II of this G.O.

7. As there is a token provision in Budget Estimate 1997-98, the expenditure sanctioned in Para 6 above shall not be treated as "New Service" but should be brought to the notice of Legislature by specific inclusion in the First Supplementary Estimate 1997-98. The Director of Environment/the Chairman, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board is requested to send necessary proposals to Govt. in Finance (BGI) for inclusion of the amount in First Supplementary Estimate 1997-98.

8. The Director of Treasuries and Accounts is authorised to draw the amount sanctioned in para 6 above and place at the disposal of the Member-Secretary, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board, Chennai-32 after the supplementary estimates are voted by the Legislature.

9. The Member-Secretary, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board is requested to release the subsidy amount referred to in the Annexure-I and II of this G.O. to the concerned Common Effluent Treatment Plant Companies which are on actual progress Common Effluent Treatment Plant's construction works and subject to all the terms and conditions stated in the scheme. He is also requested to send the progress and utilisation certificate to the Government.

10. The Member-Secretary, Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board is also permitted to adjust a sum of Rs.37.50 lakhs (Rupees Thirty seven lakhs and fifty thousand only) already sanctioned during 1990-91 in the G.O. first read above, for the Common Effluent Treatment Plant scheme viz M/sVeerapandi Common Effluent Treatment Plant (P) Ltd. Tirupur, Coimbatore District and a sum of Rs.21.14 lakhs (Rupees Twenty one lakhs and fourteen thousand only) already sanctioned in G.O. second read above for the Common Effluent Treatment Scheme viz M/s.Karur Vanchi Dyeing Enviro Tech. Ltd. Karur in addition to the subsidy amount of Rs.12.50 lakhs and Rs.14.74 lakhs respectively now sanctioned in this G.O.

11. The expenditure sanctioned in para 6 above should be debited to the Head of Account 2215 Water Supply and sanitation 02 Sewerage and Sanitation - 106. Prevention of Air and Water Pollution Schemes in the Ninth Five Year Plan VI Scheme shared between State and Centre UA, Assistance to Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board to implement Common Effluent Treatment Plants 09. Grants-in-aid" D.P.Code No,.2215-02-106 UA 0903) by giving per centre credit to Deposits and Advances-b. Deposits not bearing interest 8443.00 Civil deposits –800 other deposits-AE. Deposits of Govt. companies and Corporations etc. 49 Deposits of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (D.P.Code No.844300800 RE 490H (Receipts).

The Government have examined the above representation and have decided to confirm the draft notification published with the G.O.Ms.No.562, Home, dated 01.04.1991 by over - ruling the suggestions of the Federation subject to the modifications on the date / dates of coming into force in different districts and for different classes of vehicles.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 65 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Central Act 59 of 1988) the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Motor vehicles Rules, 1989, the draft of the same having been previously published as required by sub-section (1) of section 212 of the said Act.

(b) If the emission of smoke and the levels of other pollutants, comply with the standards prescribed in the said rule 115, a certificate shall be issued by the authority authorised under sub-rule (1) to that effect and such certificate shall be valid for a period of one year from the date of issue, subject to the condition that if, during the period of validity of certificate, the vehicle exceeds the standard of smoke or the level of other pollutants or both, the certificate issued under this clause shall cease to be valid"

In order to control air pollution, the Government in G.O.Ms.No.215, Home, dated 10.02.1992 have issued notification to amend rules 115 and 132 and to incorporate rule 116-A in the Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 according to which for obtaining a certificate of fitness the owners of the transport vehicles should produce from the competent authority a certificate on pollution level to the effect that the vehicle complies with the standard of smoke emission.

2. The Government have since decided to introduce pollution control measure to begin with in respect of goods carriages only in Madras City alone with effect from the 17th February, 1992. They accordingly direct that :-

- 1. The pollution control, measure now introduced will cover goods carriages in Madras City only;

ORDER

Emission of smoke from Motor Vehicles is a major source of pollution. Standards for the permissible limits for such emission are prescribed in the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, and the rules issued thereunder. With the rapid increase in the number of vehicles the problem of automobile pollution has assumed greater seriousness. In Madras City, the goods vehicles are subject to testing at the time of annual fitness testing. By this arrangement, only twenty thousand vehicles in Madras City are subject to regular testing. The remaining vehicles in Madras City, and all vehicles in the districts are subject to testing by the enforcing agency in a limitted way only.

2. The gradual extension of the system of pollution testing to all categories of vehicles in the entire State is necessary. The problem of pollution is severe in Madras City where seven lakhs vehicles have been registered. Apart from Madras City, Chengalpattu MGR, Dingigul - Anna and Nilgiris Districts also need priority in the matter of automobile pollution control.

3. The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has formulated proposals for pollution control in Madras Urban Agglomeration Area (MUAA) and Chengalpattu M.G.R. Dindigul - Anna, and the Nilgiris Districts. According to these proposals, all vehicles in Madras Urban Agglomeration Area will be subject to testing every six months. The testing work will be entrusted to private agencies under the supervision of Pollution Control Board and the Transport Commissioner. In respect of vehicles of State Transport under takings, testing will be done by State Transport Undertakings themselves. All vehicles requiring Fitness Certificate in the districts of Chengalpattu M.G.R. Dindigul Anna and the Nilgiris will be subject to testing by Pollution Control Board Staff.

4. The Government accept the above proposals. The Government prescribe the following procedures for controlling the pollution caused by automobiles:

In Madras Urban Agglomeration Area

- a. The scope of pollution control measures shall be extended to all vehicles in the Madras Urban Agglomeration Area. Motorised Cycle rickshaws will also be subject to pollution control.
- b. Testing and certifying for pollution standards shall be done through private agencies authorised by Transport Department in the form of a Letter of Authority as is being done in other cities like Bombay.
- c. The agencies shall be petrol bunk, automobile services centres, or automobile workshops employing qualified persons possessing a motor mechanic certificate issued by I.T.I. / a Diploma or a Degree in Mechanical or Automobile Engineering. The testing agencies should have equipment approved by NEERI and other National bodies.
- d. Technical approval of competency for testing station shall be certified by the Pollution Control Board.
- e. Selection and authorisation of testing agencies shall be done by the Committees with officials from Transport and Pollution Control Board as Members.
- f. Testing fees shall be fixed taking into account the cost of equipment, labour etc.
- g. The frequency of testing shall be once in six months.

- h. State Transport Undertakings have to make their own arrangements for testing in consultation with Transport Department and with the approval of the Pollution Control Board.
- i. So far as vehicles entering in Madras City are concerned they will be advised to undergo testing. Pollution Control Board units in the districts of Trichy, Madurai, Salem, Coimbatore and Vellore will be permitted to issue certificates of testing for vehicles coming into Madras City.
- j. Testing and inspection will be a corrective measure in the initial stage. Notices shall be issued to vehicle owners not possessing the certificate.

The Chengalpattu M.G.R. (Excluding M.U.A.A) Dindigul Anna and the Nilgiris Districts.

All Vehicles required to obtain fitness certificate (contract carriages, stage carriage including auto and goods carriages) shall be subject to testing at the time of fitness certificate. The testing work shall be done by the officials of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board.

In G.O.Ms.No.494, Home, dated 27.03.1997 it has been ordered that certain vehicles in Chennai City and Transport Vehicles in Anna District, Mannar Thirumalai District and Nilgiris District shall be subjected to emission under control certificate from the authorised service stations from 31.03.1997.

2. It has been reported that only 100 vehicles at the maximum could be tested by a centre per day. At this rate, it would take atleast 750 days to test all the nine lakhs vehicles in Chennai City. Unless or until sufficient testing stations are provided by the Administration, the Pollution check scheme could not be implemented satisfactorily. If the Departmental staff start testing the vehicles on road immediately, as per notification issued recently it would really be a hardship to the vehicle owners. To avoid hardship to the vehicle owners, the Government consider it necessary to extend the time limit for checking the vehicles on road by another six months. It has therefore been decided to appoint 31.10.1997 as the date on which rule 115(2) of the Tamil Nadu Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989 shall come into force and to review the position there after.

In the G.O. read above, the Government have delegated the powers of the Officers of the Transport Department not below the rank of Motor Vehicle Inspector Grade - II to compound and offence punishable under Sub-section (2) of Section 90 of Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 and prescribed the quantum of fines for violating the pollution standard. The Transport Commissioner has stated that Section 190(2) of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988 do not provide for any warning for compounding the offence and hence the notification issued in the G.O. read above is in violation of said section of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988. He has pointed of that in Delhi Union Territory, procedures obtained are that is any vehicle is found to be plying without any valid pollution control certificate as required in rule 115(7) of Central Motor Vehicle Rules 1989, fine is fixed straight away. If a vehicle otherwise found to be plying with valid pollution under control certificate but found emitting excess gas against the standards prescribed in Rule 115(2) of the Central Motor Vehicle Rules, then the checking officers empowered in Rule 116 follow the procedures prescribed therein by allowing 7 days time to produce the vehicle after rectification. The Transport Commissioner has, therefore, stated that the above procedure may be followed in this State also, by modifying the notification issued in G.O. Ms.No.1180, Home, dated 26.08.1996 by fixing different amounts as fine for the first and subsequent offences as provided in Section 190(2) of Motor Vehicles Act.

2. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of Transport. Commissioner, consider that the owners of vehicles violating the level of pollution be warned for the first time and that the entries for the warning be made in the registration Certificate of the vehicle. The Government direct that punishment as indicated below be imposed for violation of pollution control.

The Government have now decided to confirm the draft amendment published in the notification appended to the Government Order first read above, with certain corrections. Provided if a vehicle fails to comply with the emission standard a rejection silp shall be issued to the driver or owner of the vehicle for rectifying the defect and to present the vehicle for a fresh test within seven days from the date of such rejection. Otherwise, the other of the vehicle shall be liable for penalty prescribed under sub-section (2) of the section 190 of the Act".

2. In Form (Emission under control letter to Authority).

"(10). The authorised Emission Testing Centres shall not issue any other printed format in this respect other than the one prescribed and approved by the Government.

The pre-printed perforated computerized formats shall be in 100 sheets and serially numbered for a calendar year. The sheets shall also be affixed with the seal of the Regional Transport Officer, in whose jurisdiction, the Testing Centrre lies".

(c) after clause (15), the following clauses shall be added, namely;

"(16). The date of the test shall be printed on the photo of the vehicle also.

(17) The photo of the vehicle with Registration Number shall not be stored in a computer after the test certificate is issued.

(18) The measurement of the emission level shall be recorded and print out taken only after the monitor shows a stabilized reading of the emission level".

Thereafter, in the G.O. fifth read above, the ban imposed on registering new three seater Autorickshaw in Chennai City was extended until further orders. In order to prevent possible misuse of outside vehicles in Chennai City the bank orders imposed on registration of 3 seater Autorckshaws in Chennai City by the Government were subsequently extended by the Transport Commissioner to Thiruvallur, and Kancheepuram Districts also. This ban is still in force. The intention is not to allow fresh permits for Autorickshaws in these places.

2. A number of representations have been received requesting that new permits may be given by lifting the bank. it is viewed that issue of fresh permits to 3 seater Autorickshaws will facilitate the utilisation of Central and State Government sponsored loan schemes, apart from generating employment for youth and increasing transport facilities. Environmental Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority set up by the Supreme Court of India has suggested that in Chennai City, where the Pollution level is high, only the LPG fitted vehicles need to be registered in future. 3. Hon'ble Chief Minister has announced on 26.05.2005 that the existing ban in respect of Chennai City will be relaxed in order to grant 5000 new Autorickshaw permits to owner - cum - driver applicants only and that these new permits will be given only to the LPG dedicated Autorickshaws.

4. The Government have examined the issue in detail in consultation with the Transport Commissioner, Chennai.

5. Keeping in view the environmental concerns and in public interest, the Government have decided to grant 5000 fresh permits, in Chennai City and adjoining areas falling within the jurisdiction of Regional Transport Officer of Chennai (North), Chennai (East), Chennai (South), Chennai (West), Chennai (North West) and Chennai (South West) in relaxation of the existing ban, to owner - cum - driver applicants on the condition that they ply only new LPG dedicated Autorickshaws. The Government accordingly direct the Transport Commissioner and Regional Transport Authority, Chennai to grant 5000 fresh permits to 3 seater LPG dedicated authorickshaws to the owner - cum - driver applicants on the existing ban.

ORDER

The Hon'ble Chief Minister announced on 26.5.2005 that with a view to promote self employment and to help unemployed youth to acquire Autorickshaws for their livelihood a "Loan Scheme with Subsidy Component" would to be implemented. Under this Scheme, loans are to be offered by the Transport Development Finance Corporation and the Banks. 25% of the cost of an Autorickshaw, subject to maximum of Rs.25,000/- shall be paid as subsidy by the Government of Tamil Nadu. The Annual income of the applicant for such loan should not exceed Rs.36,000/-. The Hon'ble Chief Minister has also announced that the loan shall be applicable to prospective owner-cum-driver applicants only.

2. Pursuant to this announcement, the Transport Commissioner has prepared a Draft Scheme in consultation with the Transport Development Finance Corporation and the Banks, indicating the mechanism for disbursing the subsidy to loanees. He had also interacted with the Government Departments and Representatives of the various Banks and his Report in this regard reveals the following :

The Transport Development Finance Corporation is unable to extend loan under this scheme due to non-availability of certain mandatory provisions in their bye laws. Though the Nationalised Banks have come forward to extend loan to the applicants to purchase auto-rickshaws, they insist that a marginal amount of 10% of the cost of the vehicle should be deposited by the beneficiaries in the respective banks to avail the loan, facility. The Transport Development Finance Corporation will however be associated in disbursing the subsidy to the respective banks.

3. The Hon'ble Chief Minister has also made an announcement for issue of 5000 Autorickshaw permits in Chennai City in favour of LPG driven vehicles, in relaxation of the ban orders, to owner-cum-driver applicants. It is therefore necessary that the loan scheme is to be extended to the 5000 new LPG Auto permits to be issued in Chennai City and adjoining areas coming under the jurisdiction of Regional Transport Authority, Chennai (Joint Transport Commissioner, Chennai). As only a few outlets of LPG centres are opened in other parts of the State, priority may be given to LPG dedicated vehicles.

4. The Government have carefully examined the Report of the Transport Commissioner in the light of the position discussed in para 3 above. They have decided to approve the Loan Scheme to be implemented with the Loan Assistance of Nationalised Banks with a detailed mechanism. Accordingly, the following guidelines are ordered :

- i) The scheme shall extend to the entire State of Tamil Nadu. This is applicable to owner cum driver applicants only.
- ii) The beneficiary / applicant should possess a driving licence to drive a Light Motor Vehicle Transport vehicle / Autorickshaw.
- iii) The beneficary's annual income should not exceed Rs.36,000/annum. This should be supported by a proper certificate issued by the Revenue Department Authorities.
- iv) The beneficiary should not already possess an Auto-rickshaw permit in his / her name to avail the subsidy. An undertaking to this effect should be furnished by the applicant beneficiary, and enclosed along with the application for the grant of auto rickshaw permit.

- v) On scrutiny of the papers submitted by the applicant, the Regional Transport Authority will issue necessary proceedings in the matter. Thereupon, the applicant shall approach any of the Nationalised Banks and get Ioan. On acquiring the vehicle and payment of tax and fees, the Regional Transport Authority will issue permit for operation.
- vi) In Chennai city and adjoining areas coming under Joint Transport Commissioner (Chennai), the loan will be extended to LPG dedicated vehicles on.
- vii) A margin amount of 10% on the cost of vehicle should be deposited by the beneficiaries at the respective banks granting loan.
- viii) The permits granted under this scheme should not be surrendered before the closure of the entire loan amount.
- ix) The permit granted under this scheme should not be transferred, except in the case of death of the holder of the permit.
- x) The loan amount should not be closed with in a period of three years, i.e., in other words to say, the lock in period.
- xi) The loan amount sanctioned should be repaid within the time frame prescribed by the banks concerned.
- xii) While renewing the Fitness Certificate, the Transport Authorities should also review the repayment status of the loanee and further course of action will be taken in accordance with the rules and regulations of the banks granting loan.
- xiii) The Regional Transport Authority, Chennai (Joint Transport Commissioner, Chennai) shall be Nodal Officer for implementation of the scheme in respect of Chennai and its adjoining area placed under his charge. In respect of other Districts, the Collector of the District / Regional Transport Authority shall be the Nodal officer for Implementation of the scheme.
- xiv) The subsidy by the Government is R.25,000/- or 25% of the cost of the vehicle, whichever is less.

- xv) Subsidy amount will be released by the Transport Development Finance Corporation to the banks which have granted loan. The Transport Development Finance Corporation will draw Funds from the Government through Transport Commissioner for disbursement of subsidy to the banks according to the requirements. The Managing Director, Transport Development Finance Corporation and Transport Commissioner shall jointly evolve a hassle free mechanism for granting the loan transfer of the amount to the dealer, disbursement of subsidy etc. in consultation with the Banks concerned.
- xvi) Defalcation by a loanee will entail cancellation of permit granted.
 The decision of Regional Transport Authority will be final in this regard.
- xvii) The loan scheme is applicable only to those who have not availed the facilities offered in any other special assistance schemes.
- xviii) The new scheme will be extended only for the purchase of a new Autorickshaw from any of the authorised outlets of the models approved by the Transport Commissioner for registration.

5. The Government further sanction a sum of Rs.12.50 crores (Rupee Twelve crores and fifty lakhs only) towards 25% subsidy to be distributed to the eligible beneficiaries for buying Autorickshaw under the Self employment Scheme under the loan scheme announced by Honb'le Chief Minister.

6. A sum of Rs.12.50 crores (Rupees Twelve crores and fifty lakhs only) have been included in the First Supplementary Estimate 2005-2006.

7. The expenditure shall be debited to the following head of account loan scheme on Vehicles - 00 - Taxes on Vehicles-800 - other plan scheme II -State Plan JB Autorickshaw to unemployed youth under sub employment scheme.

In G.O.Ms.No.45, Commercial Taxes, dated 12.2.2004, notification was issued making a reduction in rate of tax from 12% to 4% in respect of the tax payable by any dealer on the sale of Pollution Control Equipments and instruments listed in the notification. The LPG Kits for automobiles was not included in the said notification as it was not certified then by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board as a pollution control equipment.

2. The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has now, certified that LPG Kit for automobiles is an Air Pollution Control device and recommended that the rate of tax for the LPG kit for automobiles may be reduced to 4% as has been notified for other pollution control equipments.

3. The Government, after careful consideration, have decided to reduce the rate of tax on sale of LPG kits approved by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board for fitting in automobiles as an air pollution control equipment to 4%. 4. The notification annexed to this order will be published in the Extraordinary issue of the Tamil Nadu Government Gazettee dated 19th October, 2005.

In order to effectively prevent and manage chemical accidents, the Government of India have drafted the details of a management structure for hazardous chemicals with Ministry of Environment and Forests as the nodal Ministry. In the reference first read above, the Government of India have suggested that in view of the fact that several agencies in the State are involved, a State level co-ordination Committee under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary will help expedite the functioning of the structure. The Government of India have requested to consider the setting up of this committee of the relevant officers.

4. The following guidelines are also issued to follow for the State Level Co-ordination Committee.

- a) The State Level Co-ordination Committee shall deal only with major chemical accidents in the State where the District Emergency Committee requires help from State Headquarters and all other resources. For this, the State Level Co-ordination Committee shall consult expert as indicated in the Annexure to this order, co-ordinate activities of the District Emergency Committee and all other Departments / Organisations and keep the State and Central Governments informed continuously about the developments.
- b) The State Level Co-ordination Committee shall act as an apex body to guide all the Departments / Organisations concerned to follow the laid down policies of the Government of India with reference to the major chemical accidents and the approved "On site / Off site Emergency preparedness plan" for various industrial units dealing with such hazardous chemicals.
- c) The State Level Co-ordination Committee shall collect and ensure that correct and appropriate information is made available to the public as and when necessary through the media.

5. The Control Room for managing the crisis situation in hazardous chemical industries will be in the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board Office. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board requested to take necessary action in the matter.

6. All the District Collectors (Chairman of the District Emergency Committee) are requested to prepare similar plan for their District.

7. The Technical Cell of the Environment and Forests Department will provide the Secretarial assistance for the State Crisis Group.

ORDER

Hazardous wastes collection, transport, storage, handling, treatment and disposal is becoming important in Tamil Nadu as in other parts of the Country. It is considered that machinery has to be evolved to manage the above activity, since there are a number of chemical industrial complexes in the State which are potential sources of hazardous wastes. The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has stated that the Common Hazardous Waste Treatment and Disposal facility will deal with hazardous wastes generated from the industrial units.

2. The Government have carefully examined the proposal for setting up Common Hazardous Waste Treatment disposal facilities in Tamil Nadu. They according sanction a sum of Rs.35 lakhs under Part II Scheme for 1993-94 for the above proposal.

3. The expenditure should be debited to 2215. Water Supply and Sanitation - 02. Sewerage and Sanitation - 106. Prevention of Air and Water Pollution - Schemes in the VIII Five Year Plan - II. State Plan - JB. Control of Water and Air Pollution - 09. Grants - in - aid (DPC No.2215 - 02 - 106 - JB 0902).

4. The Board has identified 15 units situated in Manali and Ennore Area of Chengalpattu - MGR District and has stated that the total quantity of hazardous wastes generated is 40,000 T/Year including accumulated oil bearing sludge of 25,000 T/year by MRL, Manali. He has added that a check room with a mini laboratory to carry out tests, a building area of 1,000 sq.ft. with 5 KVA back up diesal power supply, a medical van and protective clothings, equipments would be required. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has requested sanction of Rs.10 lakhs (Rupees ten lakhs only) to meet the non recurring expenditure for the scheme in 1993-94.

5. The Government accept the proposal of the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board for setting up a Hazardous Waste Disposal Facility at Chengalpattu - MGR District. The Government accordingly sanction the release of a grant-in-aid of Rs.10 lakhs (Rupees ten lakhs only) to the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board for meeting the cost of non-recurring expenditure sanctioned in para 2 above. The balance amount will be released on receipt of detailed proposals for other districts and approved by the Government.

6. The amount of Rs.10/- lakhs (Rupees ten lakhs only) released by the Government will not be paid in cash but shall be deposited in the Personal Deposit Account of the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board and operated as per the instructions issued in G.O.(Ms.) No.835 / Finance (Ways and Means) Department, dated 30.7.1985 by per contra credit under "K. Deposits and Advances (b) Deposits not bearing interest - 8443.00 Civil Deposits - 800. Other Deposits - AE. Deposits of Government Companies, Corporations etc" 49. Deposits of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (DPC. 8443 00 800 AE. 490H) (Receipts)".

ORDER

In G.O.(Ms) No.54, Environment Control dated 3.11.87, the Government have constituted State Level Coordination Committee and District Emergency Committee with Chief Secretary as Chairman and Secretary, Environment and Forest as Convenor and 14 other members representing Southern Railway, Madras Port Trust, Police etc. to prevent effectively and manage Chemical Accidents in the State of Tamil Nadu.

2. In G.O.(Ms.) N.306, Environment and Forests, dated 26.4.91, the Government constituted State Crisis Group and District Emergency Committee with State level coordination committee for managing emergencies arising out of major chemical disastors.

3. Now the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests have framed the Chemical Accidents (Emergency Planning, Preparedness and Response) Rules, 1996 in exercise of powers conferred under sections 6, 8 and 25 of Environment (Protection) Act 1986. The Government of India have notified the rules in the Gazette of India Notification G.S.R. 347 (E) dated 1.8.96. Under rule 6, 8 of the Emergency Planning, Preparedness and Response for Chemical Accidents Rules, 1996 and in supersession of order issued in G.O.(Ms.) 306, Environment and Forests dated 26.4.91 the Government of Tamil Nadu hereby constitute the State Crisis Group, District Crisis Group and Local Crisis Groups with the composition of the following :

I. The State Crisis Group shall be the apex body in the State to deal with major chemical accidents and to provide expert guidance for handling major chemical accidents.

Without prejudice to the functions specified under sub-rule (1), the State Crisis Group shall :

- (a) review all district off site emergency plans in the state with a view to examine its adequacy in accordance with the manufacture, storage and import
- (b) assist the State Government in managing chemical accidents at a site.
- (c) assist the State Government in the planning preparedness and mitigation of major chemical accidents at a site in the State.

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- (d) continuously monitor the post accident situation arising out of a major chemical accident in the State and forward a report to the Central crisis Group.

- (g) Publish a list of experts and officials in the state who are concerned with the management of chemical accidents.

7. The function of the District Crisis Group are as below :

I. The District Crisis Group shall be the apex body in the district to deal with major chemical accidents and to provide expert guidance for handling chemical accidents.

Without prejudice to the functions specified under sub-rule (1) the District crisis Group shall :-

- (a) assist in the preparation of the District off-site emergency plan.
- (b) review all the on site emergency plans prepared by the occupier of Major Accident hazards installation for the preparation of the district off-site emergency plan;
- (c) assist the district administration in the management of chemical accidents at a site lying within the district.
- (d) continuously monitor every chemical accidents.
- (e) ensure continuous information flow from the district to the centre and state crisis group regarding accident situation and mitigation efforts.
- (f) forward a report of the chemical accident within fifteen days to the State Crisis Group.
- (g) conduct atleast one full scale mock drill of a chemical accident at a site each year and forward a report of the strength and the weakness of the plan to the State Crisis Group.

9. The functions of the Local Crisis Group are as below :

I. The local Crisis Group shall be the body in the industrial pocket to deal with chemical accidents and co-ordinate efforts in planning, preparedness and mitigation of a chemical accident.

Without prejudice to the functions specified under sub rule (1), the local crisis group shall :

- (a) prepare local emergency plan for the industrial pocket
- (b) ensure dovetailing of the local emergency plan with the district off site emergency plan
- (c) train personnel involved in chemical accident management.
- (d) educate the public likely to be affected in a chemical accident about the remedies and existing preparedness in the areas.
- (e) conduct atleast one full scale mock-drill of a chemical accident at a site every six months and forward a report to the District Crisis Group.
- (f) respond to all public inquiries on the subject.

10. The above crisis groups, are formed to enhance the much needed preparedness for facing a crisis situation. The responsibility of the preparation and updation of off-site emergency plan for districts with major accident hazard has been statutorily entrusted to District Collectors in the rule entitled "Manufacture, Storage and Import of Hazardous Chemical Rules" notified in 1989. The Local Crisis Group are required to assist the District Collectors in preparation of these plans. It is pointed out that representatives of the chemical units dealing with hazardous substances / processes are also members of the District and Local Crisis Groups and on Off-Site Emergency Plan would be successful only if On-Site Emergency Plans have been prepared by the respective units. These plans are required under the law to be prepared and submitted by the occupiers of the factories to the Chief Inspectorate of Factories. Periodic meetings of the District and Local Crisis Groups would help in taking stock of the position regarding formulation of the On - Site Emergency Plans and also in determining their efficacy.

11. In regard to preparation of On-site Emergency Plan, the Chief Inspectorate of Factories in the Labour Department need to play on assertive role and stringent action should be taken under the law against the defaulters. The State Crisis Group could periodically take stock of the progress made and ensure with the help of the State Government enforcement machinery that defaulters are not spared. The State Crisis Group shall meet atleast once in 3 months and follow such procedure for transaction of business as it deems fit. The proceedings of the above meeting shall be sent to Government periodically. The State Crisis Group may co-opt any person whose assistance or advice is considered useful in performing any of its functions to participate in the deliberation of any of its meetings.

12. The District Crisis Group shall meet once in every 45 days and send a report to state crisis group with a copy to Government. The Local Crisis Group shall meet every month and forward a copy of the proceedings to District Crisis Group with a copy to Government.

13. The Secretarial assistance for meeting the State Crisis Group shall be provided by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board in coordination with Chief Inspector of Factories. The District Collectors are requested to ensure that the District Crisis Group and Local Crisis Groups are constituted and met as stipulated in para 12 above. 14. Action taken report for constitution of the Crisis Group shall be sent to Government in due course by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board and the District Collectors.

The State Bio-Technology Coordination Committee shall have the powers to inspect, investigate and take punitive action in case of violating of statutory provision through Nodal department and the State Pollution Control Board / Directorate of Health / Medical Services. 2. Now, the Chairman, Tamil Nadu Electricity Board has stated that to have better co-ordination in implementing the Government of India Notification on fly ash Utilisation and to stop the indiscriminate mining of clay/filling sand, it is appropriate to include the Commissioner of Geology and Mining Department as one of the members of the Monitoring Committee and as the Central Public Works Department authorities are one of the major consumers of Engineering products and who have developed specification for the utilization of fly ash and its products, the Chief Engineer, Central Public Works Department may also be considered as member of the Monitoring Committee. 3. After due consideration, the Government accept the suggestion of the Chairman, Tamilnadu Electricity Board and include the Commissioner, Geology and Mining and Chief Engineer, Central Public Works Department as Members of the Monitoring Committee constituted in the G.O. First read above.

ORDER

Based on the development of Ground Water Resources the Panchayat Union Blocks in Tamilnadu were categorized into Dark and Grey areas in the G.O. First read above. The Blocks with more than 85% to 100% Ground Water development were categorized as "Dark Blocks" and the Blocks with ground water development between 65% to 85% were categorized as "Grey Block". This categorisation was done in accordance with the then prevailing Ground Water Estimation Committee 1984 (GEC-1984) Norms. Thereafter the committee constituted by the Ministry of Water Resources Government of India has recominended to adopt the GEC-1997 Norms for estimation of the Ground Water resources in all the states. 2. The Government in the G.O. second read above constituted a State Level Working Group for the assessment of the ground water potential in Tamil Nadu. The above group have finalised the categorisation of the Panchayat Union Blocks as per the GEC 1997 Methodology. The Ground Water resources have be been computed as on January 1998 and the same has been projected to January 2003 on prorata basis as decided during the Working Group meeting. The above assessment report has been vetted and accepted by the Central Ground Water Board, Ministry of Water Resources, Government of India, New Delhi.

3. In his letter seventh read above the Chief Engineer (State Ground and Surface Water Resources Data Centre) has stated that based on the GEC 1997 Methodology, the Ground Water Assessment has been worked out and based on the development of Ground Water and long term water level trend, the Panchayat Union Blocks in Tamil Nadu have been categorized as over – Exploited, Critical, Semi-Critical and Safe. The Chief Engineer has proposed that in order to observe certain Ground Water discipline for implementation of Minor irrigation schemes so as to conserve and manage the ground water potential, the categorization of Panchayat Union blocks in all the districts (except Chennai District) of Tamil Nadu have to be notified and circulated to all departments and agencies dealing with the ground water development.

4. The Member-Secretary, State Planning Commission has also requested the Government to inform the Collectors of the categorisation of the Blocks as per GEC 1997 Methodology for guidance in implementation of the programmes for Rain Water Harvesting and artificial recharge of Ground water.

5. The Government have decided to approve the above proposals of the Chief Engineer (State Ground and Surface Water Resources Data Centre). Accordingly the Government approve the categorization of the Panchayat Union blocks in Tamil Nadu as Over Exploited, Critical, Semi – Critical and Safe blocks for ground water development as on January 2003 as detailed in the Annexure to this order.

6. The Government also direct that no schemes should be formulated in over exploited and critical blocks, and in semi critical and safe blocks all the schemes should be formulated in consultation with State Ground and Surface Water Resource Data Centre of Water Resources Organisation in Public Works Department. The term scheme exclude energisation of agricultural pump sets by the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board. 7. The Government further direct that appropriate rain water harvesting and artificial recharge schemes be carried out in all the categories of blocks and while carrying out of the above schemes priority shall be given to the over exploited and the critical blocks so as to avoid further deterioration.

ORDER

Pursuant to the suggestion made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister during the Review Meeting of Environment & Forests held on 9.7.2001, it was decided to create an "Environment Management Agency" to execute River Cleaning Programmes and Lake Conservation Programme on the lines of District Rural Development Agency (D.R.D.A.)

2. Accordingly the Director of Environment sent proposal for formation or "Environment Management Agency" in Chennai and Trichy at an estimated cost of Rs.63.00 lakhs. The above agency will have their headquarters at Chennai and Trichirappalli. The "Environment Management Agency at Chennai will implement the project works of Chennai City Waterways besides projects at Madurai, Tirunelveli, Rameswaram and Tiruchendur and thereby protect the health and welfare of the people. The Environment Management Agency with its headquarters at Trichy, will improve the Environmental status of people of Trichy, Erode, Thanjavur, Kumbakonam, Karur and Mayiladuthurai besides abatement of pollution in River Cauvery.

3. The functions and advantages of the Environment Management Agency are as follows :

Functions

- (i) Implementation of new River Cleaning Programmes under National River conservation Projects
- Liaison with National River Conservation Directorate, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India and get funds from Government of India Projects.
- (iii) Co-ordinate with Tamilnadu Watersupply and Drainage Board/Municipalities/ Corporations/ NGOs in the implementation of ongoing schemes.
- (iv) Implementation of new lake conservation programme under National Lake Conservation Project.
- (v) Coastal Zone Conservation
- (vi) Implementation of Environmental Awareness Programmes in Schools with NGOs.

ADVANTAGES

- It will help in implementation of Environment agenda of Department of Environment such as abatement of pollution, Coastal Zone Conservation on the field effectively.
- (ii) Environment Management Agency will be able to attract more fund from Government of India.
- (iii) Being an autonomous Agency will facilitate more effective net working with the Government and on Government Agencies.

4. For creation of Environment Management Agency at Chennai and Trichy the recurring the non-recurring expenditure works out to Rs.63.00 lakhs as detailed in the Annexure-1 and the staff pattern with financial outlay details are given in Annexure-II to this order.

5. The Govt. after careful consideration of the proposal of D.O.E. issue orders for creation of Environment Management Agency with the following composition.

- (a) The Environment Management Agency will be funded by taking 1% of the Centage charges out of 8% provided by Government of India, NRCD for the implementing agencies. The normal annual expenditure will be between Rs.60 to 70 crores so that the centage available will be Rs.60-70 lakhs.
- (b) For the above agency, a Governing body consisting of the following officers will be formed :-

- (c) The powers, functions and terms and conditions of the above Governing Board will be issued separately.
- (d) The recurring and non-recurring expenditure towards the cost of staff pertaining to the above agency will be met out by placing the same before the Governing body taking into consideration of the availability of the fund of the agency.
- (e) The Grade IV post (i.e.) Office Assistant, and Driver will be filled up on contract basis. The existing staffs available in the Director of Environment under Project Management Cell will also be utilised for the agency. The other post will be filled up as far as possible on deputation basis from Tamilnadu Watersupply and Drainage Board, Chennai Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board

and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests Office and from other Department/Boards. Since most of the new towns are nearer to Trichy, sanction be accorded in principle for two offices viz. Chennai and Trichy and the office at Trichy would be opened after the commencement of the work in these towns. Considering the important functions of the above agency, it is decided to name the agency as Environment Management Agency.

6. This order issues with the concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O. No.69830/AH&F/2002-1 dated 23.9.2002.

ORDER

The Government of India's Scheme for undertaking of studies for preparation of National River Action Plan for abatement of pollution of highly polluted stretches of River Cauvery in Tamilnadu with equal sharing of expenditure by the Central and State Government was examined by the Government in consultation with Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board. The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has prepared a feasibility study Report for 5 stretches of River Cauvery in Tamil Nadu at an estimated cost of Rs.38.20 crores. In addition to the above capital cost, the operation and maintenance cost for the 5 stretches works out to Rs.57.05 laksh. The project report covers the following components:

- 1. Interception and diversion and sewage;
- 2. Providing / upgrading sewage treatment plants;
- 3. Improvements to crematoria

- 4. Provision of low cost sanitation;
- 5. River front and bathing ghat developments;
- 6. Afforestation; and
- 7. Solid waste disposal by providing compost yard;

2. This Government have communicated their concurrence to the Government of India, conveying that 50% on the capital cost will be borne by Statement Government. As per the decision taken by the Government, a Project Report prepared by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board for the scheme of abatement of pollution of highly polluted 5 stretches of River Cauvery viz. Erode, Trichy, Kumarapalayam, Pallipayalam and Bhavani at a total capital cost of Rs.38.20 crores was forwarded to the Director, Ganga Project Directorate, Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests, in April 1994.

3. The Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests have approved the National River Conservation Programme for taking up the pollution abatment work in Tamil Nadu among other 10 States. The programme will be implemented under Centrally Sponsored Scheme on the basis of equal sharing of cost of works between the Central and the State Government. The Operation and Maintenance cost will be borne fully by the State Government concerned. Based on the approval, conveyed by the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests to go ahead with the preparation of detailed Project Report, the detailed project reports prepared in respect of 5 stretches at a cost of Rs.300.36 lakhs was forwarded to the Government of India.

4. In their letter dated 5.10.1995, the Government of India, Ministry of Enviroment and Forests have conveyed the sanction of the President to the release of Rs.45.38 lakhs in favour of Secretary, Environment and Forests Department, Government of Tamilnadu as project preparation fee for five towns viz. Kumarapalayam, Bhavani, Erode, Trichy and Pallipalayam under National River Action Plan. The above release is towards 50% share of Central Government .An equal amount has to be released by the State Government for Project Preparation Fees. (PPF).

5. Under National River Action Plan for abatement of pollution in five stretces of cauvery, the cost of investigation taken by the Tamil Nadu Water supply and Drainage Board for each stretch is as follows :

Hence, the Government of India have released the project reparation Fee of Rs.45.38 lakhs towards 50% share of the Central Government, the Chief Engineer, Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board has requested to release a sum of Rs.29.54 lakhs for taking up the investigation works of the components entrusted to Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board. He has also stated that without proper allocation funds the expenditure towards the investigations could not be incurred.

6. In the circumstances, the Government accepted the request of the Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board, Madras - 5 and sanction of sum of Rs.29.54 lakhs (Rupees Twenty Nine Lakhs and Fifty Four Thousand only) for taking up the investigation charges entrusted to Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board.



3. In the letter seventh read above the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forest, National River Consenation Directorate have conveyed their administrative approval for the pollution abatement scheme under National River Conservation Project relating to 7 additional Towns of Tamil Nadu at an estimated cost of Rs.575.30 crores. Among them the cost of the project approved for Tirunelveli is Rs.66/- crores which includes a provision of Rs.6/- crores being 10% escalation over the estimated cost worked out on fixed cost basis. The ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India have issued a notification under Sec.3(1) and Sec.3(2) (v) of the Environment Protection Act, 1986 and Rule 5 (3) (d) of Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986 dated 19.2.1991 declaring coastal stretches are Coastal Regulation Zone and regulating activities in the Coastal Regulation Zone area. As per the notification of coastal areas are classified into four categories viz. CRZ.I, II, III and IV for regulating the development activities. The Ministry of Environment and Forests and the State Government or Union Territory and such other authorities at the State Level who are designated for this purpose shall be responsible for monitoring and enforcement of the provisions of this notification within their respective jurisdiction.

2. As per the Coastal Regulating Zone Notification reports have been received from the 12 Coastal District Collectors and draft maps have been prepared by the Director of Town and Country Planning were sent to Government of India for approval. The Government of India in its letter dated 27.9.96 have approved the maps sent by the Government with certain modifications / suggestions.

3. After convening several meetings with the concerned officers in the Government letter third read above, the Government have consistituted a Task Force under the Chairmanship of Hon'nle Minister for Handloom, in State Level and District Collector as Chariman in District Level and others officer of the user Department of Coastal Zone Management plan for deciding the constitution role / function of the Coastal Zone Management Authority in the State and District Level to examine the various Acts and rules involved in implementing the Coastal Regulation zone Notification 1991 / Coastal Zone Management Plan of Tamilnadu and the proposed amendment to the existing Acts. The Director of Environment is the convener of the said Task force. The reports sent by the Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority, Director of Town and Country Planning etc. Were examined. Now the Government of India has requested this Government to set up the coastal Zone Management Authority immediately.

4. Now the Government of Tamilnadu hereby constitute 3 Coastal Management Authorities under section 4 of the Coastal Regulation Zone Notification dated 19.2.91 for monitoring and enforcement of the Coastal Zone in Tamilnadu as detailed below:-

5. The State Level Committee will be advisery in nature and will be a policy making body.

6. The District Level and the Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority area coastal Zone Management Authorities role and functions in their respective jurisdiction are as below:-

- i. To be responsible for monitoring and enforcement / Implementation of the provisions of the Coastal Regulation Zone Notification.
- ii. To ensure that the activities within coastal regulation zone take place as per approved Management Plan.
- iii. To assist the State Authority in undertaking the sponsored investigation and research activities in relation to protection and conservation of Coastal Environment.
- iv. To advice the State Government on any matter relating to protection and control of pollution in coastal areas.

- v. To act as an authority under Sec.4 of Coastal Regulation Zone Notification 1991 dt 19.2.91 for taking action on Coastal Regulation Zone Plan violations.
- vi. To co-ordinate the activities of Coastal Zone Management Committee of various coastal areas and to provide guidance.

7. The Director of Environment is directed to obtain the periodical reports from the Chennai Metropolitan Development Authority / Director of Town and Country Planning once in three months and examine the reports and send a final report to Government. The Director of Environment is directed to take necessary steps for the convening and conducting of the State Level Committee on the advice of the Vice President of the State Level Committee.

8. The above authority shall be treated as a first class authority for all purposes and the members shall be paid Traveling Allowance / Dearness allowance in the grads to which they are entitled and their expenditure shall be debited to the Head of Account under which their pay and allowance are drawn.

ORDER

The Ministry of Environment & Forests, Government of India in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (d) of sub-rule (3) dated 19.02.91 declared the coastal stretches of seas, bays, estuaries, creeks, rivers and back waters which are influenced by tidal action (in the landward side) upto 500 meters from High Tide Line as Coastal Regulation Zone and imposed with effect from 20.02.91 certain restrictions on the setting up and expansion of industries/ tourism related activities, operations or processes etc., in the said Coastal Regulation Zone.

2. The Government of India in exercise of the powers conferred under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 constituted Tamilnadu Stated Coastal Zone Management Authority under the Chairmanship of Secretary to Government, Environment and Forest Department in Notification No.S.O.994 (E) dated 26.11.98 to take measures for protecting and improving the quality of coastal environment and preventing, abating and controlling environmental pollution in the coastal areas of the State of Tamilnadu.

3. The State Coastal Zone Management Authority, interalia, is required to scrutinize the applications for projects that are proposed to be located within coastal Regulation Zone under CRZ Notification. After consideration of the proposal in all aspects, the proposals will have to be forwarded to National Coastal Zone Management Authority with its recommendations. The State Coastal Zone Management Authority at its meeting held on 07.04.99 discussed at length to levy scrutiny fee on the New Project Application which falls under Coastal Regulation Zone areas and has decided to fix the fee depending on the outlay of the project. It has been resolved to fix an amount of 0.1% of the total project cost as scrutiny fee and to maintain the amount collected as a separate fund. The Authority has also decided to utilize the fund so collected for meeting the requirements of the authority, in performing its designated responsibilities such as: a) expenditure towards demarcation of High Tide Line and Low Tide Line, b) establishment and administrative charges for taking suitable action on the implementation and monitoring of the provisions of the Coastal Regulation Zone, c) Research and Development works including training, d) identifying and implementing coastal conservation programmers and projects, e) Expenses in connection with the meetings etc.

4. The Director of Environment as Member Secretary of the authority has sent relevant extracts of the minutes referred to in Para 3 above of the Tamilnadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority held on 07.04.99 and has requested the Government and pass suitable orders on the above resolution of the Tamilnadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority.

5. The Government accept the resolution passed by the Tamilnadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority and the recommendation of the Director of Environment and a scrutiny fee of 0.1% of total project cost is hereby levied from all the Project proponents who have proposed to set up/ locate their projects within Coastal Regulation Zone. The Director of Environment is authorized to receive the scrutiny fee and sanction the related expenditure without awaiting the orders of Government in each and every case but with the prior approval of the State Coastal Zone Management Authority.

ORDER

The present status of the Hill areas of Tamil Nadu are fast reaching a point of no – return. There is undoubtedly been an alarming decline in the eco-system of the Western Ghats even within living area. This is because all economic activities, ultimately, entail increased extraction of environmental resources and always have an impact in modifying them. Majority of development activities are carried out only with general social benefits in mind involving a large number of agencies – public and private. Therefore, when the development takes place in ecologically fragile area like hills, the interaction leads to serious stress when the environment is loaded beyond its safe use capacity.

2. Often, the economic decisions are not guided by the social costs on the infrastructure and hill ecology. The entirely desirable goals of vegetable cultivation, livestock breeding, dairy development in repatriate rehabilitation, communication improvements, tourism promotion etc. have all led to overall severe determination in our hill environment. This is because of the fact that hill areas require a policy different from that of the plains which has not been fully recognized. The construction of an overall development philosophy for the hill areas is a specialist task to be done by agencies specifically committed for the task. Such an effort calls for a multidisciplinary approach which will encompass the activities of different government departments Central and State Governments, non – governmental agencies. institutions or private individuals and a comprehensive programme for implementation.

3. Considering these, it has been decided to create a body, that will develop the hills into an ecologically acceptable and environmentally desirable area of Indian Land Mass. Therefore the Director of Town and Country Planning has sent a proposal for setting up a "Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Development Authority" under the provisions of section 10 of the "Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning act, 1971".

4. The Government, after careful consideration, have decided that an Ad-hac Authority should be set up now and the same be given a statutory basis in due course. The Government accordingly direct that an authority to be called "The Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority" be constituted with immediate effect.

5. Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority shall consist of the following members.

1.	Chairman :	A very senior Officer of the IAS to be appointed by the Government (part – time)
2.	Member Secretary :	Senior I.A.S., Officer to be appointed by the Government.
3.	EX-Officio Member:	Secretary, Planning and Development Department.

6. The Government also direct that an Advisory Council consisting the following members to be constituted for the specific purpose of advising the Hill Areas Conservation Authority.

- 4&5. Chief Engineer, Irrigation & General
- 6. Director of Development
- 7. Director of Animal Husbandry
- 8. Director of Geology & Mining
- 9. One sitting member of the Legislative Assembly representing one of the constituencies in the Nilgiris District to be nominated for a two year term by the Government.
- 10. One sitting member of the Legislative Assembly representing one of the constituencies in which one or more of the Hill taluks other than Nilgiris, to be nominated for a two year term by the Government.
- 11. One Chairperson of any one of the Panchayat Union or Municipalities in the Nilgiris areas to be nominated for a two year term by the Govt.
- 12. Chairperson of the Kodaikanal Panchayat Union.
- 13. Four Environmentalists to be nominated for a two year term by the
- 17 Government and one representing Non-Government. Voluntary Orgasations connected with environment and ecology to be nominated for a two year term by the Government.
- The Authority co-opt any District Collector having jurisdiction over the Hill taluks or any other official, non-official as Associate Member or Invitee or special invitee.

7. The functions the Authority shall be as indicated in Annexure-I to this order.

8. Orders regarding the appointment of the Part – time Chairman, Member – Secretary and other members of the "Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority" will issue separately. Pending issue of orders, the Joint Secretary to Government, Planning and Development Department in charge of Hill Area Development Programme and Western Ghats Development Programme is designated and as the Ex-Officio' Officer on Special Duty' and he will form with immediate effect the "Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority" with the staff in the Hill Area Development Programme and Western Ghate Development Programme cells in the Secretariat last continued in G.O.Ms.No.105, P&D (TC I) Department dated 16.06.89 read with G.O.Ms.NC.253, P&D (OP) Dept. dated 09.11.89. The above two cells will be subsumed by the Authority and they will be merged to form the Administrative unit for the `Authority' at State level.

9. The Plan formulation cell (HADP) and the District Planning Cell at Udhagamandalam will be merged together along with the staff last continued on G.O.Ms.No.104 P&D (TC II) Dept, dt.15.06.89 and G.O.Ms.No.251, H&D (OP.II) Dept., dt.09.11.89 and the merged unit will be brought under the `Hill Areas Conservation Authority'. It will be headed by a Project Officer, a senior officer of Indian Administrative Service who will also be the Member – Secretary for the `Authority'.

10. The `Authority' shall be funded and financed by the Government. To start with, the Government accord sanction for an initial grant of Rs.2/- lakhs (Rupees two lakhs) only under the Hill Area Development Programme for setting up the `Authority' immediately. The expenditure should be debatable to "2052.00 Secretariat General Services – 090. Secretariat Schemes in the VIII Five year Plan – II State Plan – JA. Technical cell for Plan Formation under HADP – 26 Other charges – DPC 2052-00-090-JA-2602. The Amount will be adjusted from regular grant after formation of Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority.

11. The Government also direct that all plan funds for the hill areas listed in Annexure – I to this order shall be routed through this `Authority'. To start with, the Hill Area Development Programme and the Western Ghats Development Programme hitherto Administered by the Planning and Development Department shall be administered by the Authority'.

12. Sanction is also accorded for the creation of one post of `Assistant project Officer' in the scale of pay of Rs.3500-5000 initially for a period of one year form the date of employment or till the need therefor cases whichever is earlier. The incumbents of the posts will be eligible to draw besides their pay and allowances, other usual allowances admissible to Government employees from time to time.

13. Pending extension of the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to the hill areas, the Government, direct that all Government and Quasi - Government departments shall consult even now the 'Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority' in respect of all development programmes undertaken by them within the hill areas listed in the Annexure - I to this order under the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning Act, 1971. The Departments of Secretariat (Except Law, Finance and Legislative Assembly departments) are accordingly requested to issue suitable instructions to the Heads of Departments and other autonomous bodies/ compositions under their administrative control to the effect that they should get the prior clearance of the "Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority" in respect of any development programme undertaken by them in the listed hill areas before they approach the Government for administrative and financial sanctions and to draw up their future programmes for development within the listed hill areas in consultation with the "Tamil Nadu Hill Areas Conservation Authority".

14. The Government also direct that all future budget allocations relating to hill areas development including Hill area Development Programme & Western Ghats Development Programme may be transferred to the `Tamil Nadu till areas Conservation Authority". The `Authority' my also receive funds and subsidies directly from the Government of India and Union Planning Commission particularly the Western Ghats Secretariat.

15. The amount sanctioned in para 10 above shall be drawn and placed at the disposal of the Ex-officio officer on Special Duty.

16. Necessary provision will be made in RE/FMA 1990 – 91 by appropriation from savings within the grant or by providing additional amounts.

17. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U/O.No.736/FS/P/90 dated 2.2.90.

ANNEXURE – II

FUNCTIONS OF THE TAMIL NADU HILL AREAS CONSERVATION AUTHORITY

Functions listed in Section 12 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971; and

- i. To prepare an environmental report of the hill areas and keep it updated every three years.
- ii. To undertake continual monitoring of ecological parameters.
- iii. To prepare a structural development plan indicating the carrying limits of the hills and propose alternatives to the hill population where reasonable economical development cannot be locally provided without serious over all damage.
- iv. To draw up guidelines for development of hills and compulsorily require prior clearance for any development listed in Annexure – II and ban the activities listed in Annexure IV altogether.
- v. To advise government on the policy and strategy for all development activities in the hills;
- vi. To issue such directions as necessary to local authorities to enable the compliance and have necessary powers delegated to it under the Municipal and Panchayat Acts; and
- vii. To prohibit expenditure by any Government department or undertaking on any plan or scheme not cleared by it in that area and require all budgetary provisions (Plan and non plan) by all departments are only for schemes cleared by it.

ANNEXURE – III

ACTIVITIES WHICH REQUIRE PRIOR CLEARANCE OF THE AUTHORITY

1. Agriculture

- a. Projects of the restructuring of hill slopes
- b. Projects for the use of uncultivated land or semi natural areas for intensive agricultural purposes
- c. Water management projects for agriculture.
- d. Initial afforestation where this may lead to adverse ecological changes
- e. Land reclamation for the purpose of conversion to another type of land use.
- f. Poultry rearing installations
- g. Pig-rearing installations
- h. Plantations
- i. Agro- forestry, tree cropping and orchards

2. Extractive industry

- a. Deep drillings with the exception of drillings for investigating the stability of the soil and in particular:
 - Geethermal drilling
 - Drilling for the storage of nuclear waste material
 - Drilling for water supplies.

ORDER

In the W.P.No.14930 and 19\4931/ 89 etc., filed by Krishna Nagar and Kennedy Valley Welfare Associations praying for more of Stone Crushers and stone quarries operating in the vicinity to the residential areas near Thirusoolam Hills, the Judge of the Madras High Court, based on the recommendation by the Expert Committee duly appointed for this purpose, ordered among other in the order first read above, that no quarrying of blue metal should be permitted within 500 mteres of residential areas and permitted only if they are beyond 500 metres of residential area and strictly follow the procedures laid by Mines and Safety Regulations. Against this order of single Judge of High court Madras, Writ Appeals were filed in High court, Madras of the quarry owners. The Division in the order second read above modified the judgment of the Single Judge to the effect that ban so far as it related to the operation of quarries was reduced from 500 metres to 50 metres. The Kennedy Valley Welfare Association took up the matter to the Supreme Court in C.A.No.10732/95. The Supreme Court of India in the order third read above confirmed the order of the Single Judge and Set aside the High Court's Division bench order dated 11.11.94. The Tamil Nadu Building Material Manufacturers and Transporters Association filed W.P.No.5876/98 in the High Court of Madras praying to allow the guarrying and crushing operation by following relevant safety measures by leaving 50 metres distance between guarry or the crusher as the case may be and the dwelling area. The High Court, Madras observing that the law laid down by the Apex court is binding on them dismissed the W.P.No.5879/98 in the order fourth read above. Against the said order of High Court, Madras, the Tamil Nadu Building Material Manufactures and Transporters Association filed SLP (C) No.13564/96 in the Supreme Court of India.

2. In the meantime in adherence to the Supreme Court Order in C.A in No.10732/95, the Government issued amendment to Rule 36(1) of Tamil Nadu Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1959 in the G.O.fifth read above to the effect that no quarrying shall be done within a radial distance of 500 metres from inhabited site. The position was also informed to Supreme Court of India.

3. When the case came up for hearing on 08.08.2000, the Supreme Court of India observed as follows.

"The decision this corut in Kenedy Valley's case was based on the facts of that case, namely, where there was an Expert Committee's Report dated 3rd July, 1991 which had recommended a distance of 500 metres from the residential area. Not withstanding the said Report, NEERI was requested by the State Pollution Control Board to examine the matter and give a report. This report having been given, the State should have the option to choose what

parameters should be laid down unencumbered by the decision of this court in Kannedy Vallyey's case. When the State Government has two expert Committee's Reports before it, it is for the Government to consider what would be the appropriate rule to frame. As we have already observed, the direction contained in Kennedy Valley' case was issued because NEERI's report was not available at the point of time and the said direction was based on the earlier Committee's Report dated 3rd July, 1991. Moreover, the decision in Kennedy Valley's case was rendered on the facts of that case.

In the fight of the aforesaid discussion, Learned Counsel for the State Pollution Control Board and the State of Tamil Nadu seek an adjournment in order to consider whether the said respondents would want to amend the Notification and / or Resolution issued by them or not".

In this context, the Tamil Nadu Government Advocate on Record informed the Government that it would be open to the Government to re-examin the matter and fix an appromate distance taking into consideration report of Export Committee and NEERI report.

4. The Director of Geology and Mining, who was consulted the matter has informed in the letter seventh read above that in the Expert Committee's report and NEERI's report, the subject matter of stone crushers and the resulting dust pollution alone were dealt with in detail, and the reports not indicated any Standard Parameters based on which being stipulations be decided upon with reference to the operation quarries. He has further informed that quarrying operations, and the resulting dust pollution always hand in hand which cannot be separated or dealt in isolation. He has, therefore requested the Government to constitute an Expert Committee comprising the following members to go into details regarding fixation of the minimum distance to the adopted between the quarries and the adjoining inhabited sites and to submit the recommendations to Government with a time.

The Government after careful examination accept the requestion of Director of Geology and Mining and they according direct that an Expert Committee comprising the following members be constituted to re-examine minimum distance of metres between the quarries and the adjoining inhabited site prescribed in Rule 36(1) of Tamil Nadu Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1959 taking into consideration, findings of earlier Expert Committee and NEERI report etc. and make recommendations on the appropriate distance to be fixed between the quarries and adjoining inhabited sites with detailed justification for the same.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-Sections (1) and (1-A) of section 15 of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 (Centrla Act 67 of 1957), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby makes the following amendments to the Tamil Nadu Minor Mineral Concession Rules, 1959.

2. The amendments hereby made shall come into force on the 18th day of October, 2002.

AMENDMENTS

In the said Rules, in rule 36,

- 1. in sub rule (1)
 - a. Second previso shall be omitted
 - b. in the Explanation, for the expression for the purpose of this subrule, the expression for the purpose of sub-rules (1) and (1-a) shall be substituted.
- 2. After sub-Orule (1) the following sub-rule shall be inserted, namely

(1-A) (a)

.(a) No lease shall be granted for quarrying stone within 300 metres (three hundred metres) from any inhabited site.

Provided that the existing quarries which are subsisting under current leases shall be entitled for continuance till the expiry of the lease period. The lessees whose quarries lie within a radius of 300 metres from the inhabited site shall undertake blasting operations only after getting permission of the Director of Mines Safety, Oorgaum.

Provided further that the new and existing units of quarries shall also be required to comply with the Pollution Control Measures (i.e) dust control measures) besides complying with the other conditions in regard to Pollution Control Measures.

.(b) The methodology specified on column (2) of the Table shall be adopted in respect of the operational sources specified in column (1) there of for rock quarrying operations.

SI. No.	Operational Source	Methodology for controlling the dust
1.	Drilling	Liquid injection (water with a wetting agent) of capturing and venting emissions to a control device.
2.	Blasting	Adoption of good blasting practices
3.	Loading (at Mines)	Water Wetting
4.	Transport	Watering treatment with surface agents, soil stabilization on paving.

1.(c) No new layout, building plans falling within 300 metres from any quarry should be given approval by any agency unless prior clearance of the Director of Geology and Mining is obtained. On receipt of proposals for according clearance, the Director of Geology and Mining shall decide upon the continuance or closure, as the case may be of any quarry which is situated within 300 metres from the new layout, building sought for such clearance.

ORDER

In order to develop the hills into an ecologically acceptable and environmentally desirable area, in G.O.Ms.No.44 Planning and Develop (TCII) Department dt.02.04.1990 the Government have constituted a high level committee namely Hill Area Conservation Authority (HACA) as per the orders issued in this Government, all the Government and Quasi Government Department shall consult the Hill Area Conservation Authority in respect of all development programmes undertaken by them as listed in annexure – III of the said Government order in all Hill Taluks under Annexure I of the same Government order. 2. The question of exempting the villages which are located in the plain though they fall in the talks notified as hill taluks in the G.O. was discussed in the 22nd Hill Area Conservation Authority meeting held on 21.02.2001 and it was decided to obtain the details from the District collectors regarding the villages which are actually located in the hill areas. The Director of Geology and Mining has scrutinized the same in consultation with the District collectors and sent his proposals indicating the details of villages which should fall within the purview of Hill Area Conservation Authority.

3. Based on the reports received from the District Collectors concerned and in consultation with Director of Geology and Mining, the Special Commissioner of Town and Country Planning has sent amendment proposals to Annexure – I of Government order first read above and to notify the name of Villages which are actually located in hill areas of the hill taluks of the various Districts.

4. The Government have carefully considered the proposal of the Special Commissioner of Town and Country Planning and approved the list of villages sent by the District Collectors, which are actually located in the hill areas of the hill taluks. The names of the Districts and the names of the villages located in the hill taluks of the respective districts are given in Annexure – I to this order.

5. The Government in partial modification of G.O.mr.No.44, Planning and Development (TCII) Department dt. 02.04.1990 direct that in respect of the villages identified as Hill village in these Hill Taluks, indicated in the Annexure – I to this order, permission from HACA should be obtained for all activities specified in Annexure – II of this Government order before they are taken up for execution or grant of permission.

6. The Government also direct that for other villages lying in the plains of these Hill Taluks, obtaining permission from the Hill Area Conservation Authority is not necessary and the respective Departmental officials should pursue the activities specified in the Annexure II to this Government order as per the existing Acts, rules and orders in force.

7. The Government further direct that, in respect of all villages in the Hill Taluk wherever Reserve Forest lands are available, the activities mentioned in Annexure – II of this Government order in those lands have to be got cleared by the Hill Area Conservation Authority, as required in the Government order first read above.

ACTIVITES WHICH REQUIRE PRIOR CLEARANCE OF THE AUTHORITY

1. Agriculture

- a. Projects for the restructuring of hill slopes
- b. Projects for the use of uncultivated land or semi natural areas for intensive agricultural purposes.
- c. Water management projects for agriculture
- d. Initial afforestation where this may lead to adverse ecological changes
- e. Land reclamation for the purpose of conversion to another type of land use.
- f. Poultry rearing installations
- g. Pig-rearing installations
- h. Plantations
- i. Agro-forestry, tree cropping and orchards

2. Extractive Industry

- a. Deep drillings with the exception of drillings for investigating the stability of the soil and in particular:
 - Geothermal drilling
 - Drilling for the storage of nuclear waste material
 - Drilling for water supplies.
- Extraction of minerals other than metalliferous and energy producing minerals, such as lime stone, marble sand, gravel, shale, salt phosphates and potash
- c. Extraction of coal and lignite by underground mining.
- d. Extraction of coal and lignite by open case mining
- e. Extraction of petroleum
- f. Extraction of natural gas

- g. Extraction of Ores
- h. Extraction of bituminous shale, peat and moss

ORDER

According to G.O.Ms.No.10, Environment Control Department, dated 12.12.1983, all developmental scheme in the State costing over Rs.50 Lakhs and also schemes costing Rs.50 lakhs and less, which in the opinion of the Head of Department, are likely to interfere with the environment have to be referred to the Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee for review and clearance from environmental angle.

2. Taking various factors into consideration, Industries Department has suggested the present investment limit of Rs.50/- lakhs to get the clearance from the High Level Committee say be increased to Rs.5 crores. Also industrial units taking up the manufacture of engineering products, electronic equipment which do/not have pollution problems, and such units which are not likely to have any type of pollution may be exempted from getting clearance not withstanding their level of investment. Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has agreed with the suggestions.

3. In G.O.Ms.No.84, Health and Family Welfare dated 7.1.77, the Government among other committees constituted the committee on Industries with Commissioner and Secretary, Industries Department as Chairman. Its formation is to look into aspects at impact of industries on environment. Industries Department as further suggested that the above sub-Committee may be powered to decide and refer only cases which the Sub-Committee wells necessary to the High Power Committee and other cases may be disposed of by it.

4. The Package of several incentives to accelerate Industrial development in Tamil Nadu was announced by the Government on 8.5.1988. Following is one among them:

"Delegation of powers for environmental clearance-Liberalization".

5. In pursuance of the above announcement, the Government examined the suggestions of the Industries Department detailed in para 2 above and in suppression of the orders issued in the G.O.read above, pass the following orders:

- 1. The present investment limit of Rs.50 lakhs for clearance by the Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee shall be increased to Rs.5 crores.
- 2. Unit, which are not likely to have any type of pollution problem are exempted from getting clearance not withstanding their level of investment.
- 3. Reference to Sub-Committee viz. Committee on Industrial will be insisted only where an industry falls within the list of 18 industries specified in G.O.Ms.No.1 Environment Control Department dated 10.4.84 mentioned in the annexure 2 and the Sub-Committee is empowered to refer only such of those to the Tamil Nadu State Environmental cases where the environmental implications of Committee Industries/projects and involvement and large the sub-Committee feels necessary and where other cases shall be disposed of by it.

In G.O.Ms.No.1335, Health and Family Welfare department dated 10.8.03 the Government directed that the Tamil Nadu Environmental Board constituted in G.O.Ms.No.555 Health and Family Welfare Department dated 4.3.76 be reconstituted as the Tamilnadu Environmental Committee. This Committee was finally reconstituted in G.O.Ms.No.3, Environment and Forests Department dated 7.1.92 with the Hon'ble Chief Minister as Chairman, Minister (Industries) as Vice Chairman and the Secretary, Environment and Forests department as the convenience. There are 25 other members and most of them are official members. Projects costing Rs.5 crores and more are referred to the Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee for Environmental Clearance.

2. Based on the guidelines issued in G.O.Ms.No.548, Environment and Forests Department dated 8.8.90 the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board forward the proposals to the Government for its clearance. The Government place them before the Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee for clearance after getting the recommendation of the sub committees, reconstituted in G.O.Ms.No.819, Environment and Forests dated 3.12.90 depending upon the nature of project.

3. Recently Government in their order (D) No.10, Industries Department dated 13.1.95 have constituted High Power Committee under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, with Hon'ble Minister (Industries) as member. The Managing Director, SPICOT is the convenor/Member Secretary of the Committee. The object of the Committee is too provider power, land and to accord clearance relating to pollution Town Planning etc. for the projects costing more than 50 crores under the Single Window concept to minimise the delay in implementing the projects.

4. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has expressed a view that the formation of the High Power Committee supersedes, the Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee and that therefore, it is not longer necessary to wait environmental Committee. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board had also suggested that in future the cases where the industries have made application to the Tamil Nadu. Pollution Control Board for clearance and had obtained No objection Certificate be brought before the High Power Committee. The Chairman, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board has also stated that inrespect of all cases, in which Government of India's clearance had been obtained, it is not necessary to insist upon clearance by the Tamil Nadu State Environment Committee.

5. As the High Power Committee was constituted in the year 1995 for speedier implementation of the projects in industrial section in this state, and it also considering the environment aspects of the projects costing more than Rs.50 crores, the Government consider that these projects need not be referred to Tamil Nadu State Environmental Committee again. In the Government Order read above, the Government have constituted a High Power Committee under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister for speedier implementation of projects in industrial sector whose project cost exceeds Rs.50 crores. During the last two meetings held earlier, the major projects brought before this Committee were for environmental clearance. The Committee at its meetings held on 18.10.96 discussed about the actual role played by this High Power Committee. It was noted that in to-day's context when each statutory body is encouraged to play its assigned role and discharge its responsibilities without any delay and according to the rules, there may not be any need for this Committee to meet and give specific directions. The Government expects each statutory body to be responsive to the requests from the industries and look at the problems in a constructive way and deal with them and pass orders under the rules concerned. In case there is any delay in a particular case, it can be identified early and taken up with the concerned body. There is also an industry Advisory Committee chaired by the Hon'ble Chief Minister. Any Instance of undue delay can be brought before that there is no need for this High Power Committee to continue its working and has recommended to the Government for dissolution of this Committee.

3. This Committee shall invite any other officers whenever matters pertaining to their organisations are to be taken up for consideration.

4. The above High Power Committee will meet at suitable intervals and any entrepreneur whose project cost exceeds Rs.50 crores requiring assistance/having problems in setting up their industries would be free to approach this Committee for clearances.

5. The convenor of the Committee will circulate in advance to all the members of the committee, a list of cases that will be taken up for consideration at the meeting.

6. The date and venue of the meeting should be given wide publicity sufficiently in advance requesting entrepreneurs to send their written representations detailing their problems before a specified date for consideration of the Committee.

7. The Committee shall make an integrated approach to the proposals placed before them and give `clearance' in principal so that the concerned agencies can taken up each proposal for formal processing and approval. The `clearance' given by the Committee should be treated as clearances by the various Departments and Bodies, who should issue their orders within the stipulated time. The progress will be reviewed in the subsequent meetings until each of the projects is finally implemented.

ORDER

In the letter first read above Government of India have issued the following amendment to Environment Impact Assessment Notification, 1994.

- (i) Public Hearing has been made as mandatory for all the Projects covered in Schedule I of the EIA Notification 1994.
- (ii) Powers have been delegated to Stated Department of Environment for issue of Environmental Clearance to those categories of thermal power plants which are listed in Schedule 1 of the Notification, 1994.

2. The amended Notification will apply to all projects which are received after 10th April 1997. The Ministry of Environment & Forests will process the projects received prior to 10th April, 1997. The Government of India has brought to the notice of the Government of the reported non-compliance of environmental regulations and the need for improving the quality of monitoring and enforcement activities of the State Environmental Agencies. The

Environmental Impact Assessment Notification of January, 1994 clearly states in para 3(c) that no construction work, preliminary or otherwise, relating to the setting up of the projects should be undertaken till environmental/site clearance is obtained. It is, felt necessary that the concerned State authorities including the State Pollution Control Boards, State Industr. Department, Electricity Boards etc. should advice the project proponents not to initiate the project for those 29 categories of developmental projects covered in the EIA Notification of January 1994 before the Central Environmental Clearance. Otherwise, this will amount to violation of the Environmental impact etc.

3. In order to have proper assessment of the project after obtaining the views of the General Public the Government of India inter-alia, amended the EIA Notification dated 10.4.97 for giving effect to Public Hearing as on factory for all the projects covered in schedule. I of the EIA Notification with effect from 10.4.97. In the amended Notification, the Government of India has detailed the composition of the Public Hearing Panel in the Districts, process for Public Hearing, Notice of Public Hearing and access to the executive summary. The composition of public Hearing Panel Consists of the following namely:-

- i) Representative of State Pollution Control Board;
- ii) District Collector or his nominee;
- iii) Representative of State Government dealing with the subject;
- iv) Representative of Department of the State Government dealing with Environment;
- Not more than three representatives of the local bodies such as Municipalities or Panchayats;
- vi) Not more than three senior citizens of the area nominated by the District Collector.

Accordingly all the District Collectors were requested to form the Public Hearing Panel in their districts and send the panel of names for the approval of the Government. Out of 29 districts 23 district collectors have sent the list of panel for Public Hearing to the Government for approval.

4. The Member Secretary, Tamil Nadu Pollution Central Board has reported that the Public Hearing has to be conducted by the State Pollution Control Board as per the provisions envisaged in the Notification S.O.318 (E) dated 10.4.97. He has further reported that the Project proponent has to be invited for the hearing and the proponent has to bear the cost of the Public Hearing as fixed by the Board.

5. The Government after careful examination of the proposal of the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board and the panel of names submitted by the 23 Districts Collectors decided to constitute the Public Hearing Panel in the 23 districts. The Government accordingly constitute the committee for public hearing panel with the composition of members as detailed in the Annexure to this order,

6. The Government direct the Tamilnadu Pollution Central Board to conduct the Public Hearing as per the provisions envisaged in the Environmental Impact Assessment Notification, 1994 as amended on 10.4.97

7. The Government also direct that the expenditure to be incurred for conducting the Public Hearing will be collected from the proponent concerned.

8. The panel of the remaining 6 Districts will be issued separately.

The Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests in its letter dated 19.5.97 stated that the following amendment to Environmental Impact Assessment Notification, 1994, (published in the extraordinary Gazette of India dated 10.4.97 Part II, Section3, Sub-section (ii):-

S.O: 318(E) i. Public Hearing has been made mandatory for all the projects covered in Schedule I of the Environmental Impact Assessment Notification, 1994 from 10.4.97.

 Powers have been delegated to the State Department of Environment for issue of Environmental Clearance to those categories of thermal power plants which are listed in Schedule I of the EIA Notification of 10.4.97. The amended Notification will apply to all projects which are received after 10th April, 1997.

2. In consonance with the orders issued by the Government of India in para 1 above the Government of Tamilnadu issued orders constituting public hearing panels in G.(Ms.) No.487, Environment and Forests, dated 22.12.97 and in letter No.(Ms) No.75, Environment and Forests, dated 21.3.98.

3. In respect of Thermal Power Plant, the Government of India in their Notification, published in the "Gazette of Indian Extraordinary Part II, Section 3, sub-section (ii), dated 10.4.97 S.O. 319(E) Schedule I have specified the following category of Thermal Power Plants requiring/ environmental clearance from the State Government :-

- I. Co-generation Captive Plants:
- i. Co-Generation Plants All Co-generation plants irrespective of the installed capacities.
- ii. Captive Power Plants Upto 250 MW (both coal and gas/ naphtha based) coming up separately and not along the main industry.
- II. Utility Projects:
- i. Coal based plants upto 500 MW using fluidizing bed technology subjects to sensitive areas restrictions.
- ii. Coal based Power Plants upto 250 MW using conventional technologies.
- iii. Gas/ Naphtha based plants jupto 500 MW.

4. The Government of India have also stated in the said Notification dated 10.4.97 that any project proposed to be located within the radium of twenty five km. boundary of reserved forests, ecologically sensitive area which may include National Parks, Sanctuaries, Biosphere Reserves, critically polluted area and within fifty kms. Of inter-state boundary shall require environment clearance from the Central Government.

5. In the said Notification Schedule II the procedure for seeking environment clearance and in Schedule III the composition of the Expert Committee to be constituted by the State Governments for Environmental Impact Assessment have been specified.

In the reference first read above, the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forest have sated that as per Notification S.O. 319 (E), dated 10.4.97, powers have been delegated to State Department of Environment for issue of environmental clearance to those categories of thermal power plants which are listed in Schedule I of the Environmental Impact Assessment

Notification of 10.4.97. The amended notification will apply to all projects which are received after 10.4.1997. The category of Thermal Power Plants requiring environmental clearance from the State Government as mentioned in Schedule I of the Notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests, dated 10.4.97 (S.O.319(E)) are as follows:-

- I. Co-generation Captive Plants:
- i. Co-generation Plants : All Co-generation Plants irrespective of the installed capacities.
- ii. Captive Power Plants : Upto 250MW (both coal and gas/ naph.tha based) coming up separately and not along the main Industry.
- II. Utility Projects
- i. Coal based plants upto 500 MW using fluidized bed technology subject to sensitive areas restrictions.
- ii. Coal based Power Plants upto 250 MW using conventional technologies.
- iii. Gas/ Naphtha based plants upto 500 MW.

Every project proposed to be located in the following shall require environmental clearance from the Central Government:-

- a. Critically polluted area; or
- b. Within a radius of fifteen kilometers of the boundary of
 - i. reserved forests
 - ii. ecologically sensitive areas which include national parks, sanctuaries, biosphere reserve, and
 - iii. any state.

In the said notification Schedule II, the procedure for seeking environmental clearance and in Schedule II, the composition of the Expert – Committee to be constituted by the State Governments for Environmental Impact Assessment have been specified. 2. ORDER

The United National Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) held at Rio-de Janerio in June 1992 has initiated a process of interaction of countries characterized by interdependence. The Agenda 21 of the said Conference has declared that the integration of environment and development concerns and the devotion of greater attention to them will lead to the fulfillment of basic needs, improved living standards for all, better protected and managed eco-system and a safer and more prosperous future. This can be achieved only through global partnership and interracial cooperation.

2. The Agenda 21 envisages the Government as a Nodal Agency with the cooperation of the National and International Organisations for implementation of the programmes under Agenda 21. The key to success of Agenda 21 is an integrated sustainable development involving multi-disciplinary approach involving sectors like Agriculture, Food Production, Population Control, Health Care, Education Training, Clean Technology, Conservation of Natural Resources etc. with Central focus on Human Resource Development.

3. The Government attach a lot of importance to the Agenda 21 of the said Conference and they have decided to give concrete shape to the above goal by creating a separate line department designated as DEPARTMETN OF ENVIRONMENT.

4. The Government, therefore, sanction the creation of Department of Environment as a line department. This department of Environment will function under the administration control, guidance and supervision of the Environment and Forests Secretariat at the Government level.

5. The proposed department of Environment will be a Nodal department for dealing with environmental management of the State. The Department will be in-charge and implementation of Major Projects like National Lake Conservation Programme, Pollution Abatement in Cauvery System, Pollution Abatement in Coastal Riverine System in Madras City etc. In addition, the Department of Environment will deal with all the aspects of Environment other than those dealt with by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board from time to time.

6. The Government direct that the "Department of Environment" will have, to start with, the following divisions as part of its organization:

- a. Land use division
- b. Solid waste to management division
- c. Water resources division
- d. Coastal zone environment management division.
- e. Impact assessment division.
- f. Environment audit
- g. Environmental education/ awareness.

Each division shall be headed by an appropriate officer specialized in the field, preferably in the Cadre of Deputy Director/ Assistant Director. Each division will be supported by adequate ministerial staff.

7. The Government initially sanction a lumpsum provision of Rs.5.27 lakhs (Rupees five laksh and twenty seven thousand only) (Rupees four lakhs and twenty seven thousand recurring and Rupees one lakh non-recurring) towards the creation of the "DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT" with the required staff and other requirements as detailed. In Annexure – I and II under Part-II Scheme for the year, 1995-96.

8. The staff sanctioned are eligible to draw pay, Dearness allowance and other allowances as admissible under the orders in force.

9. The Government also direct that the existing vehicle attached to Technical Cell be transferred to the Department along with the post of the Driver.

10. This expenditure should be debited to the following Head of Account:

"3435 Ecology and Environment 03 Environmental Research and Ecological Regeneration 001 Direction and Administration Schemes in the English Five Year Plan. It State Plan JA. Creation of Department of Environment" (D.P.CODE 3435 03 0013A 0005).

ORDER

The Director of Town and Country Planning submitted draft Zoning regulations on use of land and building particulars in urban areas. These regulations list out the uses permissible in each of the use zone and the restrictions to be divided into the following six major use zones.

- 1. Residential Use Zone
- 2. Commercial Use Zone
- 3. Industrial Use Zone
- 4. Educational Use Zone
- 5. Public and Semi public Use Zone
- 6. Agriculture Use Zone

of course, the residential use zone has been further sub divided into two categories namely;

- 1. Primary Residential Use Zone and
- 2. Mixed Residential Use Zone

The Industrial Use Zone has been similarly sub-divided into three categories namely:

- 1. Controlled Industrial Use Zone
- 2. General Industrial Use Zone
- 3. Special Industrial and Hazardous Use Zone

2. The direct has also stated that the Tamil Nadu Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, provides for the Zoning of areas under Section 17(1) and 20(2) through the Master Plans and detailed Development Plans respectively. He has recommended that the draft Zone regulations may be approved and communicated to the Local Planning authorities for adoption as part of the Master Plan for proper Land use Planning and control in addition to other regulatory measures and that as for the Madras Metropolitan area a copy of the regulations may be sent to the Member Secretary, Madras Metropolitan Development for adaptation as part of the Madras Metropolitan Development Plan with such modifications may necessary in consideration with him (the Director) and the Government.

3. A copy of the draft regulations was sent to the Member Secretary, Madras Metropolitan Development Authority for his views. He has started that the Comprehensive land use proposals and zoning regulations for Madras Metropolitan Area are under preparation and that the suggestion of the Town Planning Directorate will be considered and incorporated to the extent as may be necessary in the final proposals.

4. The Government has examined the suggestion. They accept the views of the Members – Secretary, Madras Metropolitan Development Authority so far as it Relates to the Madras Metropolitan Area and as for other urban areas of the State. The Government approve in principle the draft zoning regulations submitted by the Director of Town and Country Planning. The Director is requested to furnish copies of the draft zoning regulations to the Local Planning Authorities as soon as they are constituted.

- 7. Parks and Playfields.

USE ZONE 1(b) MIXED RESIDENTIAL USE ZONE Uses Permitted

- 1. All uses permitted under Use Zone (a) i.e. Primary Residential Use Zone.
- 2. Hostels and single person apartments
- 3. Community Halls, Kalyanamandapam, Religious buildings, welfare centres and Gymnasia.
- 4. Recreation clubs, Libraries and Reading rooms

Use Zone III (a) Controlled Industrial Use Zone Uses Permitted

- 1. All commercial uses listed under use zone 1(a), 1(b) and 2 i.e. residential and commercial use zones;

In pursuance of the orders issued in the Government Memorandum and in the Government Order first and second read had been issuing Health and Preventive Medicine had been issuing Health Clearance Certificate to new Industries for the treatment and disposal of effluents. The Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board has been constituted with effect from 27.02.82 under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1974. Consequently, the instructions mentioned above, have become null and void as per section 60 of the said Act. As per Section 25 (1) and 26 of the water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the consent of the Board is to be obtained by the new and existing industries for letting the sewage or trade effluents into any stream or well. Similarly, issue of the consent under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, is also vested with the above Board. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine has therefore requested the Government to issue suitable instructions to the Executive Authorities of all local bodies on the procedure to be followed by them in obtaining "Health Clearance" before the grant of licences for Dangerous and Offensive Trades.

2. As per Sections 25(1) and 26 of the water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 consent of the Tamil Nadu Prevention and Control of Water Pollution Board is to be obtained by the new and existing Industries for letting the sewage or trade effluents into any stream or well. Hence the Executive Authorities of all Local Bodies are informed that before granting licences under the concerned Local body Acts, they should require the entrepreneurs to produce the consent issued by the Tamil Nadu Prevention and control of Water Pollutions Board, in so far as it relates to the disposal of effluents along with the application for licence as a pre-requisite condition. The Local Bodies will however continue to consult the Municipal Health Officer or District Health Officer, as the case may be, as statutorily required under the provisions of the Local Body Acts and the rules issued thereunder, in respect of grant of licence for all Dangerous and Offensive Trades from the Public Health point of view, as hither-to done by them.

3. The Collectors are requested to communicate the order to all the Panchayat Union Commissioners and Executive Officers of all Town Panchayats in their Districts for their information and guidance.

ORDER

The vehicle population is increasing day-by-day in the city of Chennai. The City Traffic Police has taken various measures to ensure free flow of traffic. Despite the best efforts of the City Traffic Police, the vehicular traffic sparts at many points during peak hours. Of the factors which contribute to the traffic congestion on the City roads, the movement of heavy vehicles carrying goods to various centres in the City and harbour increases the volume of traffic during the day time and causes disruption to the free flow of traffic. As such imposition of restriction on the movement of heavy vehicles on the City roads is necessary to ensure free flow of traffic. But the total ban on the movement of heavy vehicles in the City will affects the development activities. Considering the above aspects, the Commissioner of Police has proposed that the movement of heavy vehicles such as lorries, trailers, etc. may be restricted in the stretches of 19 roads in the City of Chennai including Anna salai as indicated in the Table below. He was further suggested the movement of heavy vehicles in all these roads except Anna salai shall be restricted between 07.00 hours and 21.00 hours and in the stretches of Anna Salai between 07.00 hours and 23.00 hours so as to reduce the congestion and ensure free flow of traffic on the City road. He has suggested alternative routes for the vehicles intended to take these roads so that the movement of goods and the commercial and developmental activities are not effected. He has also suggested that essential services may be considered for exemption.

The Government after careful consideration accept the proposal of the Commissioner of Police, Chennai and implement these restrictions from 01.03.2000. Accordingly, the notification appended to this order will be published in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette.

2. The Commissioner of Police, Chennai is requested to implement the orders in the Notification with effect from 01.03.2000. He is also requested to cause appropriate traffic signs to be placed or erected under section 1156 of the Motor Vehicles, Act, 1988 (Central ACt 59 of 1988).

3. The following Notification, will be published in the Tamil Nadu Government Gazette Extraordinary, dated the 22nd February, 2000:-

ORDER

Pan masala containing tobacco was introduced in Indian market during the 1970s. Research and studies on pan masala/gutka reveal that it is likely to be carcinogenic. When combined with tobacco, it not only leads to cancer but damages other organs of the body as well. The haemodynamic effects of pan masala intake reveals an acute increase in pulse and blood pressure in healthy volunteers. In a study published in the National Medical Journal of India, it is said that symptoms of oral cancer were seen even within 2-3 years of starting the habit of using pan masala/gudka. Chromosomal damages were found in those chewing pan masala even without tobacco. Chewing tobacco is a known cause of cancer of oral cavities, even without labacco. Chewing tobacco is a known cause of cancer of oral cavities, pharynx and oesophagus. It is also suspected to have a role in causation of coronary artery disease. Oral sub-mucous fibrosis is a non-reversible condition with progressive restriction in opening of the mouth. Study of the effect of individual constituents of pan masala containing tobacco and their likely effect in its combination also suggests the carcinogenicity of this mixure. The information on alkallnity of saliva after use of pan masala and release of higher quantity of arecholine with roasted arecanut (the form of arecanut in plan masala) as compared to bolled or soaked arecanut, further reveals higher toxicity of pan masala containing tobacco as compared to traditional betel liquid with tobacco. Thus there is sufficient evidence that pan masala/gutka containing tobacco is carcinogenic to human beings.

2. Chewing of pan masala/gutka/chewing tobacco as such or as an ingredient in any food item should be prohibited as chewing of these articles, is definitely injurious to health. it is further ascertained that about the one third of all cancer admissions to the Madras Government General Hospital, were of cancer of the cheek associated with chewing tobacco. Catecha a major ingredient of pan masala has a potential to cause cancer. Nearly one third of all cancers that occur in the country are attributable to tobacco use. It is possible that the widespreed use of tobacco chewing habit is responsible for the high incidence of cancers of the oral cavity in India. Other observational studies also demonstrate that the habit of using gutka/pan masala by school students and other adolescents are on the increase. Many of them appear to become addicted to this habit, which is very harmful to them. All these studies necessitate the banning of the sale of chewing tobacco, pan masala and gutka containing tobacco in any form or any other ingredients injurious to health under whatever name or description to ban the sale of chewing tobacco, pan masala and gutka in the State in the interest of public health under section 7(iv), of the Prevention of Food Adulteration Act, 1954 (Central Act 37 of 1954).

ORDER

Due to the initiative taken by Hon'ble Chief Minister and on the discussion arrived at in the Collectors Conference held on December 2002, the following decisions were arrived at in respect of disposal of Bio Medical Waste in Govt. Hospitals.

- For towns with population of less than 5 lakhs, the option of deep burial of anatomical waste and autoclaving of infected waste should be followed by Government Hospitals.
- ii. For the six Corporation town, it was decided to set up common incinerator facility for the Government Hospitals by identifying suitable locations.
- iii. As regard private sector, the same policy would be followed.
- iv. Central facilities with incineration, set up through Indian Medical Association, would be made mandatory for the Corporation towns.

- v. In the other towns, these health facilities would have the option of deep burial of body parts and autoclaving of other infected wastes.
- vi. In the district headquarters towns, some of the nursing homes may not have space for deep burial. The Collector may be asked to find a common burial site, which could be used by the private medical institutions by paying a cost.

2. The Director of Medical Education has sent the proposal for establishment of the common Bio-Medical waste facilities for treatment of the Bio-medical waste of all Government Hospitals in Chennai City coming under his control at Chengalpattu Medical College Hospital, Chengalpattu.

3. The Government has examined the proposal in detail and decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Medical Education for establishing a common Bio Medical Waste disposal facility at Chengalpattu Medical College Hospital, Chengalpattu and provision of autoclave in the Chennai City Government Hospitals including a little bigger units to the three Government Gyrace and Obstetrics hospitals where bio-medical waste is always quantitatively more and a similar unit to the Tondiarpet communicable Disease hospital under the control of Chennai Corporation at a total cost of Rs.269 lakhs (Rupees Two hundred sixty nine lakhs only) as shown in the Annexure to this order in all the City Govt. Hospitals in Chennai.

4. The Government direct the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation to implement the Bio Medical Waste treatment facility as a loan financed project. The Managing Director, T.N.M.S.C. Ltd., is instructed to obtain loan from HUDCO (or) TUFIDCO. The cost of operation and capital cost servicing will be met by payment of service charges. The Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation is requested to have consultative agency such as I.I.T/ Anna University in the project at 1% of the project cost.

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5. The Director of Medical Education is requested to send necessary proposal to the Government fixing the Service Charges.

ORDER

District Collector, District Environmental Engineer of Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board and Commissioner of Corporation / Municipality were already members in the existing committee. Since there is already a Municipal Chairman in the Committee the name of the Regional Director of Municipal Administration need not be included as suggested by the Second State Finance Commission and it has been proposed to include the name of Assistant Director, Special Village Panchayat (Previously Assistant Director of Town Panchayat) as suggested by the Second state Finance Commission.

The Government have examined the recommendations of the Second State Finance Commission and have decided to reconstitute the District Environmental Committees in the State Accordingly, in partial modification of the order issued in the G.O. read above, the Government direct that the District Environmental Committee already existing in the G.O. read above be reconstituted consisting of the following members viz.,
